*CCQ holds a member Block Contest where members create a block with a designated theme for an upcoming Opportunity Quilt. The blocks are voted on at the Quilt Show. Also, the previous year's Opportunity Quilt winner is chosen at the Quilt Show. Tickets are sold during the year and all proceeds go to a local charity.

Programs and Workshops

General Meetings (begin at 7pm):

Some General Meetings include CCQ member activities, such as:

- **Quilt Challenge** – participants make quilts using specific guidelines or fabrics. In the spring, members vote on their favorites.

- **Mystery Quilt** – each month participants receive directions for making one block of the mystery quilt. In the spring, finished quilts are displayed.
- **Show and Tell** – at the end of each meeting members are invited to show off their recent work. Many members stay for this inspirational ending to a fun evening.

Saturday Workshops - mid-year, we organize a one-day, super *Saturday*, group of workshops and classes that our members have recommended. These activities are taught by members for members.

Small Groups and New Member Teas - due to the size of our guild, we offer *New Member Teas* where you will be introduced to our *small groups*. These small groups set their own meeting times and activities. It's a great way to make friends.

Auction - each year in December we hold a live and silent *auction*. The auction is open to the public and features quilts, handmade items, trips and services.

Outreach – members reach out to our community to share quilting skills with youth, and the non quilting community.



Comfort Quilts – members make lovely quilts and throws from donated fabrics and services. The finished quilts are given to programs within our area that help children, teens, and adults in need.

Retreats

Each *fall* and *spring* we offer a retreat to our members. Retreats are a time for members to quilt “without distraction” if they so choose. Each retreat also offers a variety of classes, activities, and field trips for attendees. Housing and food is great! A retreat is a wonderful way to “get away from it all” and be with like-minded friends in a beautiful setting.
