The exhibit runs through April 30, 2017.

Arden Shelton's red and white masterpiece, "Oregon Vortex" is a semi-finalist at Paducah! Quilt Week is April 23-30, 2017.

This evening five nonprofit organizations were introduced and voted on to receive the proceeds from the next opportunity quilt. The charities receiving consideration were: Birthright of Vancouver USA; Family Solutions; FISH of Vancouver, Klinekids Kids Fishing, and Open House Ministries.

Gerrie Thompson and Beverly Woodard reviewed the winners of awards and prizes. Janet Fogg's was presented a check for her Best of Show, titled "Emma's Dream." Total entries for 2017 were 331, with 60% of those entries judged.

Linda Pritchard presented the Viewers Choice awards. The results of the Block Contest were delayed until May due to absence.

Debby Potter announced the 2017 Challenge "Quilt the Quote" results, with Karen Griggs Saltzberg taking third, Jean Seale second, and Lynn Czaban first place.

The Dianne Kane and Wilma Scott Show announced the theme and dates for next year's really big show: April 5, 6, 7, 2018 "Once in a Blue Moon"

Sonja Hughes reports that ALL 6500 tickets sold for the Opportunity Quilt sold, with \$6640.78 including donations raised for SSSR. Betty King of Tualatin Oregon won, purchasing one ticket!
