

# **You're A Grand Old Flag**



**You're a Grand Old Flag - You're a high flying Flag,  
And forever in Peace may you wave,  
You're an emblem of the land I Love, The home of the free and the Brave.  
Every heart beats true under Red, White and Blue.  
Where there's never a boast or brag.  
“But should auld acquaintance be forgot,”  
Keep your eye on the Grand Old Flag!**

\* \* \*

George M Cohen, at age 28, was an American composer, playwright and performer. His birth certificate states he was born on July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1878 - BUT George & his family always said he was ‘born on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July’!

George wrote this song for a play he was starring in titled, GEORGE WASHINGTON, JR. It appeared on stage January 19, 1906 and was titled “You're a Grand Old Rag.”

On February 6, 1906 it was recorded as a 78 RPM single under that title. That same week, the musical premiered at The Herald Square Theater in NYC. Since George was the star and highlight of the show, he proudly sang his rendition of “You're a Grand Old Rag” as he marched across the stage carrying an American flag.

The play and song were both big hits, but the political backlash surprised and bothered Cohan. He explained that patriotism was THE main theme of the musical and that the phrase “Grand Old Rag” actually came from an old Army veteran.

The story is explained on the Library of Congress website:

The original lyric for this perennial G.M. Cohan favorite came, as Cohan later explained, from an encounter he had with a Civil War veteran who fought at Gettysburg. The 2 men found themselves next to each other and Cohan noticed the vet held a carefully folded but ragged old flag. The man reportedly turned to Cohan and said “She's a grand old rag.” Cohan thought it was a great line and originally named his tune “You're a Grand Old Rag,” Many groups and individuals objected to calling the flag a “rag,” so he decided to “give ‘em what they wanted” and switched words, renaming the song “You're a Grand Old Flag.”

On **June 2, 1906**, the song was copyrighted with its new name and the sheet music was reprinted and hugely popular, becoming the first song of the musical to sell over a million copies of sheet music!

We hope you will find time this summer to work on the kits we have prepared. Jane Dudley and her long arm group will be working throughout the summer on a slightly reduced schedule as will the Comfort Quilt kit makers. BUT...the need continues so we will fit as much work (fun) in as we can.

The backlog of quilts needing long/medium/short arm work continues (that's really a good thing...so many quilts, so few longarmers). These quilts are for cuddling/comfort so they don't need fancy stitching. Some of you are new owners of quilting machines and this is a great way to practice your skills.

If you are interested in helping with the making of kits or sewing, please call Kathy Stonich.

Space is limited but we will work up a schedule that will work for you. New ideas are welcome. We have both an electric and a crank cutter with lots of dies available to make the pre-cut kits easy to prepare.

The Comfort Quilt committee prepares kits made available at no cost to CCQ members. Backing and batting are added to the returned finished tops and then distributed for members to finish and/or bind.

The finished quilts are donated to many local charitable and community groups.


