MARCH! Spring is coming, and never too early for me. The first CCQ Retreat of the year will be here soon. It's been one of my favorite activities since I joined the guild. It seems the Pacific Northwest has escaped severe winter weather on this trip around the sun. I would love more sunshine, soonest.

Speaking of shiny, wasn't that Auction something to see? I am sorry if you missed it, but I hear it will be coming around again. Kate G. and her crew of marvels did an outstanding job of collecting, and organizing, and running a brilliant fundraiser for FISH (Friends In Service to Humanity) Vancouver, and Clark County Quilters. I know there is concern, even controversy, about the split of the proceeds. FISH will get the larger share, after expenses. This was a budget meeting decision, to balance our budget in a year when we changed to a charitable non-profit. The guild membership voted on this and it was approved in September 2017. Having these funds is fortunate, as we have moved downtown to the more expensive meeting location. And in future, each recipient will again be referred to the membership. And the percentage of proceeds they get may be referred, too.

Budget. It's not the fun part of guild business. Our operating procedures say we have to balance the budget every year. Planned income must equal forecast expenditures. The reserve funds keep us going from July until about March. Then we start to get more of the income from dues and the quilt show. "My" budget has been in the red for most of the year. The retreats zero out eventually, and some activities like Three for One generate income but need starting cash to get going. While it seems like we have a lot of money in the bank, we need it to continue offering quality programs, pay insurance, negotiate better equipment storage fees, pay reservations and advance fees for the big quilt show and retreat venues, and have prudent reserves against unforeseen events. All the officers and committee members I have worked with are husbanding resources to the utmost. Marshalling volunteers is a huge responsibility, and we hire only a few tasks, like moving a short ton of equipment for shows, and set up for meetings, a new requirement in Warehouse '23. We do a lot with very little money, and ask \$40 annual dues.

There is a dues scholarship fund for those surprised by the change from \$25. Please do speak to, call, or email our Treasurer, Stephanie Harland, for concerns and to apply for a gift from anonymous donors. This fund is NOT from guild monies, but graciously gifted, so no one has to drop out due to the dues increase. We have our strength in numbers, and the different talents of our members. Our guild is vibrant and flourishing. Let's have a great spring and look forward to a BLUE MOON in April.

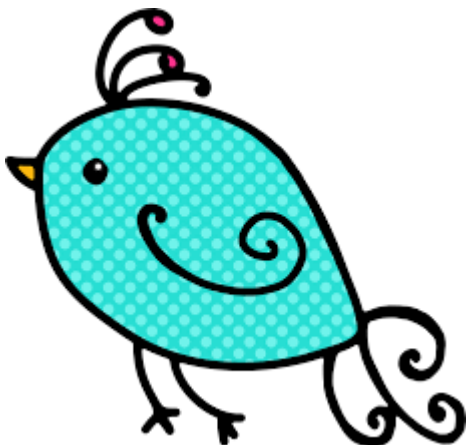

The mainstay of Outreach, empowers teens from 6th thru 12th grade with the tools and opportunities needed to build a foundation of healthy behaviors, life skills with a sense of purpose, and avoid risky behaviors. Caring adult mentors guide students through a combination of engaging projects that help teens build strength and hone social skills to help create success later in life. These skills include empathy, teamwork, responsibility, initiative and problem solving. We partner with Juvenile Justice Systems to assist in providing a safe and positive place for these individuals to complete their community service hours while learning the basic skills of sewing and creating quilts that are then donated back into the community.

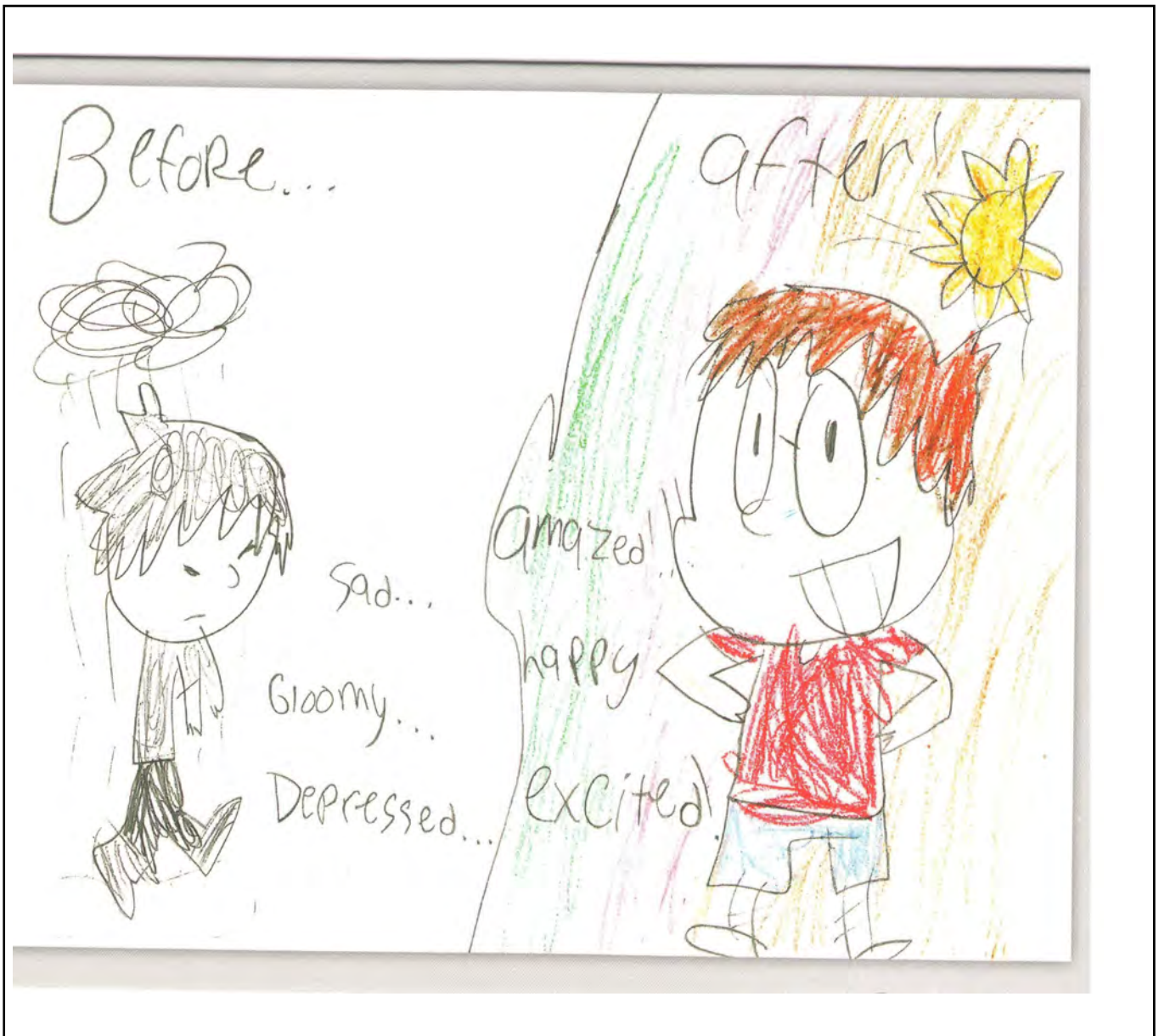

Financial Aid for Annual Dues

At the January meeting the guild voted to increase our yearly dues to \$40.00 for the 2019 fiscal year which begins on July 1, 2018. This increase will help to maintain the financial health of our guild and to continue the many programs we have come to expect. For some of our members this increase might cause financial hardship due to their income, or because of extenuating circumstances such as medical bills.

For those in need of help, the board is currently working on setting policies and procedures for the awarding of partial scholarships for the increase in our dues. An application form will be available in the April newsletter and on the website. The applications will be handled discreetly.

We have received \$250.00 in donations to help fund the program, which becomes a restricted account in our budget. The money can only be used for dues and any unused funds will carry over for use of the scholarship program. If you would like to help out those in need, consider donating to the scholarship fund. Now that we have 501(c)3 tax status, your donation may be tax deductible if you itemize.
