### Meet the company that moves our Quilt show equipment.

Last guild year, our CCQ board voted to have a professional moving company move our equipment from our storage unit to the various quilt show venues. In the past, we have relied on volunteers (mostly men) to move this equipment. Because of potential safety issues and liability if someone was hurt, we looked for a moving company that we could afford and could work with our various shows.

### Enter Peter Clarke and ANC Moving Company.

He started in 1998 (originally Clarke Moving company) moving pianos but then in 2000 enlarged his company and now moves residential and commercial businesses. He is very willing to work with customers to find the right moving package that works for you. ANC Movers is not a one size fit all moving company. He gave CCQ a flat fee of \$300 to move equipment from the storage unit to the show venue and then pick up and return to the storage unit. It was a super bargain and if you helped with the set up or take down at the April quilt show, you probably saw Peter and his team in action.

**Fat Quarters** are described by AllPeopleQuilt.com as being typically folded and sold individually or packaged in a towering bundle. The 18" x 21" rectangles win the precut popularity contest over 2 1/2" stripes, 10" squares or 5" charm squares. The term FAT comes from the quarter-yard cut that offers more width than the traditional quarter-yard, 9" x 42" cut.

Our FAT Quarters this guild year will have a different theme each month and will always be mentioned in this article.

For each fat quarter you bring to the meeting --- you are invited to put your name on a piece of paper. Bring 1 - get one piece of paper --- Bring 3 - get 3 entry papers! Sometimes members even put another members name on the entry and when their name is drawn --- BIG surprise for them!

In this collaborative training session, be prepared to share your own good, bad, and ugly experiences. Collectively, we can become the best around at sharing our love and knowledge of quilting.

Dianne has a Masters in Adult Education and has taught this "train the trainer" course to hundreds of trainers in a multitude of industries. Her participants appreciate her ability to make the learning process a very positive, welcome experience. Expect to go away from the training session with a new energy and a collection of ideas to make you even better at what you love to do.

The cost will be \$5—just enough to cover the cost of photocopying the course manual.


